Building and architecture are the cause of about 40% of all CO2 emissions worldwide and the work of B01 arquitectes, in architectonic design but also in related activities (R&D, assessments, consultancy), focuses on the reduction of the ecological footprint of building. At this moment in time, this is the most important responsibility that architects have to

assume, and also their biggest task. Right now the office is working on the project of a CO2-neutral winter sports complex, SnowWorld Barcelona, a development of 45 million €.

Josep Maria Canyelles, a recognized expert in Corporate Social Responsibility, is experienced in the public, private and social sectors. He has a Master's Degree in Public and Social Policies. His roles include: promoter of Responsabilitat
